Talks about dancers' hard life and how they have little time for outside life. Dancers feel great attachment to their partners with reference

		to Margot Fonteyn with Michael Somes and Rudolf Nureyev.

She surrounded herself with dancers who were correct, but had no temperament, also her company was made up of tall and short dancers, she being the ideal height in the middle, the ideal figure. She was marvellous in vignettes and he describes the dances 'Californian Poppy' and 'Dragonfly', with film sequences and speaks of the amazing lightness and speed with which she moved.
